March 18-22, 2026 Morgan's Wonderland Camp in San Antonio, Texas

Expected Attendance:

- 100 scientists & clinicians (disciplines include epigenetics, genetics, rare disorders, oncology, therapeutic development, neurodevelopment, overgrowth, autism)
- 150 affected individuals and their families

Details of Program:

The TBRS Summit is an extremely special event and will take place at Morgan's Wonderland in San Antonio—the epicenter of the inclusion movement. The facility features a fully inclusive theme park and camp and a comprehensive multiassistance center.

For people living with rare diseases, the sense of isolation can be profound—but when families and communities come together, that burden is lightened through shared understanding and support. Creating opportunities for people to meet others who face similar medical journeys fosters resilience, friendship, and a powerful sense of belonging. These connections not only help people with TBRS feel seen and understood but also give them the chance to bond—laughing, playing, and having fun alongside peers who truly understand their experiences. It's essential for parents of special needs children to spend time together, as shared experiences and mutual understanding can provide much-needed emotional support, strength, and a sense of community. A strong, united rare disease community offers more than emotional support; it builds lifelong networks that empower families and help children thrive despite the challenges they face.

Gordon Hartman, Founder of the Gordon Hartman Family Foundation and Morgan's Wonderland Park and Camp - Gordon is a devoted TBRS dad and champion of inclusion who created Morgan's Wonderland, the world's first ultra-accessible theme park where people of all abilities can play and connect. Inspired by his daughter Morgan, Gordon works tirelessly to break down barriers for individuals with disabilities through his foundation and inclusive initiatives like Morgan's Sports and the MAC, helping families feel supported and welcomed.

Kate Tatton-Brown, MD, Clinical Geneticist, St. George's Hospital London - Dr. Tatton-Brown is the geneticist who helped discover Tatton Brown Rahman Syndrome (TBRS) and is dedicated to improving the quality of life for those affected. She continues to work closely with our community, partnering on our patient registry and advancing understanding of TBRS symptoms, surveillance, and treatment strategies.

Harrison Gabel, PhD, Associate Professor, Washington University School of Medicine - Dr. Gabel is a neuroscientist whose laboratory studies molecular mechanisms of gene regulation in the brain, with a focus on how disruptions contribute to neurodevelopmental diseases. A champion of collaboration within the TBRS Collaborative Research Network, he works closely with our community to explore gene therapy and other treatment approaches for TBRS.
